Today the needs of travel agents are more diverse than ever. With NewGen ISS, IATA is introducing three new accreditation models to offer travel agents more choice and flexibility.



GoLite: IATA Accreditation made easy



What is it?

An entry-level accreditation with minimal financial requirements.



Simpler and easier accreditation



Ability to ticket in the BSP using IATA EasyPay or customer cards



No annual financial reviews



No minimum Financial Security if only using IATA EasyPay



GoStandard: A new and improved version of the existing IATA accreditation model



What is it?

An enhanced version of the existing accreditation model which includes two new key features – a new eWallet payment solution called IATA EasyPay, and a Remittance Holding Capacity (RHC) for cash sales.



Country-specific accreditation per local financial criteria and requirements



Access to all available payment methods including BSP Cash, customer cards and the new IATA EasyPay

All accredited agents will automatically fall into this accreditation model once NewGen ISS is implemented in their market



Agents can opt to convert to any of the other accreditation models if they wish to do so



GoGlobal: A one-stop-shop for multinational agents



What is it?

A new option for multinational agents which offers a single global accreditation and risk management for all their locations worldwide.



Eliminates the need for multiple BSP applications



Offers greater efficiencies, more transparency and a simplified risk management process

By allowing agents to comply with one global set of financial requirements for all locations



Removes the complexity of meeting different financial requirements across markets
